Hike Nova Scotia Annual Report 2023-24

Here are some of the highlights on progress in the five areas of the Hike Nova Scotia Strategic Plan, covering activities between April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024. Equity, diversity, inclusion and access is a lens applied to all five strategic directions, which include:

- Advocacy: Be a recognized and respected voice for walking, hiking and snowshoeing
- 2. **Capacity** Building: Increase walking/hiking/snowshoeing and outdoor skills and knowledge
- 3. **Leadership**: Be a strong leader in the walking, hiking and snowshoeing movement with sound organizational practices
- 4. **Places and Spaces**: Support partners in the creation and development of places and spaces for walking, hiking and snowshoeing
- 5. **Promotion**: Promote and encourage more responsible walking, hiking and snowshoeing





Advocacy

- Participated in government consultations including the NS Active
 Transportation Plan, NS Protected Areas Strategy and NS Accessibility Standard
- Continued to work to gain a permanent seat on the provincial Trail Strategy Coordinating Group
- Ran the #LoveOurTrailsNS campaign in February, engaging MLAs with our trails



- Met as part of a coalition with NS Natural Resources and Renewables and NS Environment and Climate Change about updating the Provincial Parks Act to better protect provincial parks and protected areas
- Provided letters of support for various trail groups for trail funding applications
- Promoted the results of the winter 2023 trail manager survey in the media, received 14 media hits

Capacity Building

- Offered 7 Outdoor Council of Canada courses for 62 participants, including a Navigation course for the Confederacy of Mainland Mi'kmaq
- Offered 6 Re-Connecting with Nature workshops for 75 participants
- Offered 10 webinars on hiking-related
- topics for 219 participants

- Provided equity and inclusion training for Hike NS board, staff and instructors
- Increased membership by 2 percent



 and offered LNT workshops
- FarOut Guide for the Nova Scotia section of the International Appalachian Trail became available
- Distributed 774 Hiker Challenge badges and launched 5 new regional badges (Digby, Cape Breton Highlands, Region of Queens, Pictou County Coast and Cliffs of Fundy Geopark)

- Translated Walk Leader training module into French
- Expanded walking groups into a number of equity deserving communities including 3 black communities, a newcomer community and a community with a very high rate of folks experiencing poverty.



- As of March 31, 2024, 65 walking groups with an estimated 911 participants
- Held 17 in-person and virtual walk leader training sessions for 134 leaders
- Nova Scotia Walk Day on May 10, 2023 had 70 events with 500 walkers
